THE ARTIST WAS FIDDLIN' JOHN CARSON, THE SONG WAS "LITTLE OLD LOG CABIN IN THE LANE"...AND IN 1923, IT BECAME THE FIRST COUNTRY HIT

OUTRO/INTRO: FROM 1923, THAT'S SOME OF COUNTRY MUSIC'S VERY FIRST "HIT" RECORD...

"LITTLE OLD LOG CABIN IN THE LANE" BY FIDDLIN' JOHN CARSON. WELL, THE COUNTRY



OUTRO/INTRO: THAT'S PART OF THE VERY FIRST CHART RECORD BY THE ONE AND ONLY BRENDA LEE. BRENDA WAS ONLY TWELVE YEARS OLD IN 1957 WHEN SHEESET AN ALLTIME RECORD FOR YOUNGEST FEMALE SOLO ARTIST EVER TO HIT THE COUNTRY TOP FORTY. SHE DID THAT WHEN HER SONG "ONE STEP AT A TIME" REACHED THE #15 SPOT IN THE NATION. THEN...SIXTEEN
YEARS LATER, THE ALLTIME RECORD WAS ESTABLISHED FOR THE YOUNGEST FEMALE SOLO
SINGER EVER TO HIT #1 SHE WAS BORN OCTOBER 13TH 1959...AND ONE MONTH AFTER HER
FOURTEENTH BIRTHDAY, SHE HAT #1 WITH THIS SONG. FROM 1973, HERE'S MARIE OSMOND
WITH "PAPER ROSES":

OUTRO: FROM NOVEMBER 1973, THAT'S "PAPER ROSES" BY MARIE OSMOND...AT FOUR-TEEN YEARS OF AGE, THE YOUNGEST FEMALE SOLOIST EVER TO HIT #1.

INTRO: WE'RE WENDING OUR WAY THROUGH THE AMERICAN COUNTRY COUNTDOWN "BOOK OF RECORDS"...AND WE'RE IN THE CHAPTER ON "YOUNGEST RECORDING ARTISTS." LET'S SEE NOW...IT SAYS HERE THAT THE YOUNGEST MALE SOLOIST EVER TO HIT THE TOP FORTY DID SO IN 1964 JUST 3½ MONTHS BEFORE HIS FIFTEENTH BIRTHDAY. HERE'S A PIECE OF THE SONG HE SET THE RECORD WITH:

OUTRO/INTRO: IN 1964, "LONG GONE LONESOME BLUES" REACHED #5 ON BILLBOARD'S COUNTRY CHART...AND MADE FOURTEEN YEAR OLD HANK WILLIAMS JR. THE YOUNGEST MALE SOLO SINGER EVER TO HIT THE TOP FORTY. NOW...TURNING THE PAGE TO... "YOUNGEST MALE SOLO ARTIST TO HIT #1"...WE FIND THE AGE GOING UP SEVERAL YEARS. IN 1956, JUST SEVEN WEEKS AFTER HIS 21ST BIRTHDAY, HE REACHED THE #1 SPOT WITH THIS SONG HERE'S ELVIS PRESLEY:

OUTRO: FROM 1956, THAT'S ELVIS PRESLEY AND "I FORGOT TO REMEMBER TO FORGET"...THE #1 SONG THAT MADE THE 21 YEAR OLD FUTURE-KING THE YOUNGEST MALE SOLDIST TO HIT #1 IN COUNTRY CHART HISTORY.

THIS IS OUR SPECIAL PRESENTATION OF THE AMERICAN COUNTRY COUNTDOWN "BOOK OF RECORD AND COMING UP NEXT...THE ONLY SINGER TO SCORE #1 SONGS IN EACH OF THE PAST FOUR DECADES...AND I'LL TELL YOU ABOUT FOUR CLASSIC COUNTRY SONGS WITH THE SAME MELODY!

INTRO: MY NAME'S BOB KINGSLEY...AND THIS IS THE AMERICAN COUNTRY COUNTDOWN "BOOK OF RECORDS" WHERE THE NAME OF THE GAME IS "SUPERLATIVES." WE'VE GOT THE BIGGEST, THE SMALLEST, THE LONGEST, THE SHORTEST...AND SOME CATAGORIES IN BETWEEN.

HOUR FOUR, PAGE THREE

IN THE HISTORY OF BILLBOARD'S COUNTRY CHART, ONLY ONE SINGER HAS HAD #1 SOLO HITS
IN EACH OF THE PAST FOUR DECADES. THIS MAN HAD HIS FIRST #1 RECORD IN 1959...AND
IN 1980, HE SANG HIS WAY INTO HIS FOURTH HITMAKING DECADE WITH HIS BIGGEST RECORD
OF ALL. HERE'S GEORGE JONES WITH "HE STOPPED LOVING HER TODAY"

OUTRO: FROM 1980, "HE STOPPED LOVING HER TODAY"...BY GEORGE JONES, THE ONLY SINGER IN CHART HISTORY TO RACK UP #1 SOLO HITS IN FOUR DIFFERENT DECADES.

INTRO: VIN DUR AMERICAN COUNTRY COUNTDOWN "BOOK OF RECORDS", WE TURN ONCE AGAIN
TO THE CHAPTER ON "ODDITIES." YOU KNOW, FOR MANY YEARS NOW...ONCE A SONG IS
RECORDED, IT'S ALSO COPYRIGHTED. BUT IN THE EARLY 1900'S....

TODAY'S COMPLEX COPYRIGHT LAWS WERE YET TO BE WRITTEN. NOW ANY MELODY THAT EXISTED BEFORE THE COPYRIGHT LAW IS CALLED "TRADITIONAL" AND IS SAID TO BE IN "PUBLIC DOMAIN." WHAT THAT MEANS IS THAT ANYONE WHO WANTS TO USE ONE OF THOSE OLD MELODIES IS FREE TO DO SO. AND THAT'S HOW...DURING ONE 22 YEAR PERIOD...THERE WERE FOUR COUNTRY HITS WITH THE SAME BASIC MELODY. THIS PARTICULAR MELODY IS VERY OLD AND BRITISH...AND IT WAS FIRST USED IN COUNTRY MUSIC IN THIS 1929 RECORDING OF "I'M THINKING TONIGHT OF MY BLUE EYES"...BY THE CARRER FAMILY.

OUTRO/INTRO: THERE'S PART OF A 1929 RECORDING BY COUNTRY MUSIC'S FAMED CARTER FAMILY. "I'M THINKING TONIGHT OF MY BLUE EYES" USED AN ANCIENT BRITISH MELODY THAT SHOWED UP AGAIN SEVEN YEARS LATER...THIS TIME IN AN INSPIRATIONAL SONG WHICH BECAME A MAJOR HIT, A FIRST HIT FOR A 33 YEAR OLD SINGER NAMED ROY ACUFF. THE SONG WAS "GREAT SPECKLE FIRD":

OUTRO/INTRO: FROM 1936, THERE'S A BIT OF ROY ACUFF'S RECORDING OF GREAT SPECKLE BIRD." SIXTEEN YEARS LATER, THAT OLD BRITISH MELODY SURFACED ONCE AGAIN...THIS TIME IN THE BIGGEST COUNTRY HIT OF 1952...HANK THOMPSON'S "WILD SIDE OF LIFE".

OUTRO/INTRO: IN 1952, HANK THOMPSON'S "WILD SIDE OF LIFE" WAS #1 FOR 15 WEEKS...
AND THE SONG THAT FINALLY REPLACED IT AT #1 WAS KITTY WELLS MUSICAL REBUTTAL TO "WILD SIDE OF LIFE"..."IT WASN'T GOD WHO MADE HONKY TONK ANGELS"...ONCE AGAIN USING THE SAME MELODY:

OUTRO: THAT'S COUNTRY MUSIC'S FIRST FEMALE SUPERSTAR, KITTY WELLS WITH PART OF

HER 1952 HIT, "IT WASN'T GOD WHO MADE HONKY TONK ANGELS." OF COURSE, KITTY'S RECORD WAS AN "ANSWER" SONG TO HANK THOMPSON'S "WILD SIDE OF LIFE"...AND BOTH SONGS USED THE SAME BASIC MELODY THAT HAD PREVIOUSLY BEEN USED IN 1936 FOR ROY ACUFF'S "GREAT SPECKLE BIRD"...AND BEFORE THAT, IN 1929, BY THE CARTER FAMILY FOR "I'M THINKING TONIGHT OF MY BLUE EYES." FOUR HIT SONGS...FOUR SETS OF LYRICS TO ONE MELODY...FROM THE "ODDITIES" CHAPTER OF THE AMERICAN COUNTRY COUNTDOWN "BOOK OF RECORDS." NEXT UP, THE #1 SONG WITH THE FEWEST MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS ...AND THE MOST SUCCESSFUL SINGER IN CHART HISTORY!

INTRO: AND ON WE GO WITH OUR SPECIAL PRESENTATION OF THE AMERICAN COUNTRY COUNTDOWN "BOOK OF RECORDS." I'M BOB KINGSLEY, AND OVER THE YEARS...THE AVERAGE NUMBER OF MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS ON COUNTRY MUSIC RECORDING SESSIONS HAS GREATLY INCREASED.

SO IT'S UNUSUAL, INDEED, TO DISCOVER A MILLION-SELLING COUNTRY/POP SMASH FROM 1957 THAT USED ONLY IWO INSTRUMENTS.

BUT...DISCOVER IT, WE DID...AND HERE IT IS. FEATURING ONLY A DRUM AND A PIANO, HERE'S JERRY LEP LEWIS WITH "GREAT BALLS OF FIRE":

OUTRO: FROM 1957, IMERE'S JERRY LEE LEWIS'S "GREAT BALLS OF FIRE", FEATURING ONLY

A DRUM AND A PIANO...THE FEWEST INSTRUMENTS

ON A #1 HIT IN THE HISTORY OF

BILLBOARD'S COUNTRY CHART.

INTRO: PAIS NEXT ARTIST HAS HIS OWN CHAPTER IN OUR "BOOK OF RECORDS", AND
DESERVEDLY SO! HE STILL CARRIES THE SQUARE-JAWED, BROAD-SHOULDERED, SHYLY
SOFT-SPOKEN AURA OF THE TENNESSEE PLOWBOY HE ONCE WAS. HE'S WORTH MILLIONS NOW,
BUT HE KEEPS WORKING...MAKING AN OCCASIONAL RECORD IN NASHVILLE...AND BREAKING
ATTENDANCE RECORDS IN COMPETITIVE SPOTS LIKE RENO, TAHOE AND LAS VEGAS, NEVADA.

ONE OF THE DIFFERENCES BETWEEN HIM AND OTHER ARTISTS IS THAT HE'S ALWAYS THOUGHT
OF HIMSELF AS A DUSINESS. HE HAS A CERTAIN THACE AND HE LIVES UP TO IT. AND OF
ALL THE STARS THAT SHINE WITH VARYING DEGREES OF BRIGHTNESS OVER THE TENNESSEE
HILLS THAT OVERLOOK NASHVILLE, THE STAR NAMED EDDY ARNOLD IS DISTINGUISHED FROM

ALL THE OTHERS...BECAUSE IT'S BURNED CONSISTENTLY BRIGHTER AND LONGER THAN ALL THE OTHERS. EDDY ARNOLD'S FIRST SINGLE WAS RELEASED IN 1945 AND SINCE THEN, HE'S SOLD OVER 80 MILLION RECORDS. HE'S ALSO SPENT OVER 1600 WEEKS ON BILLBOARD'S COUNTRY CHART...MAKING COUNTRY MUSIC HISTORY WITH 135 CHART RECORDS. HERE NOW IS A MONTAGE OF TWELVE OF THE BEST.

OUTRO: FROM THE AMERICAN COUNTRY COUNTDOWN "BOOK OF RECORDS", THAT'S A MONTAGE OF TWELVE OF THE 135 CHART SONGS BY EDDY ARNOLD, THE MOST SUCCESSFUL COUNTRY MUSIC RECORDING ARTIST IN CHART HISTORY! MY NAME'S BOB KINGSLEY AND WE'LL TRACE THE EVOLUTION OF COUNTRY MUSIC'S MOST FAMOUS SONG...WHEN "THE BOOK OF RECORDS" CONTINUES!

INTRO: I'M BOB KINGSLEY AND THIS IS OUR SPECIAL TRIP THROUGH AMERICAN COUNTRY COUNTDOWN'S "BOOK OF RECORDS." WE'RE UP NOW TO THE MOST POPULAR COUNTRY SONG IN HISTORY...AND IT'S ONE OF THE THREE BEST KNOWN SONGS IN THE ENTIRE ENGLISH LANGUAGE! THE BEST KNOWN SONG OF ALL IS "HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO YOU." IT WAS COPYRIGHTED IN 1910 AND SINCE THEN, NOT A SINGLE DAY HAS PASSED WHEN "THE HAPPY BIRTHDAY SONG" HAS NOT BEEN SUNG IN AMERICA AND THROUGHOUT THE WORLD. OF THE OTHER TWO BEST KNOWN ENGLISH LANGUAGE SONGS...ONE IS "WHITE CHRISTMAS", THE OTHER IS A COUNTRY SONG...THE MOST FAMOUS COUNTRY SONG IN HISTORY. IT WAS WRITTEN IN 1939 BY COUNTRY MUSIC HALL OF FAME MEMBER AND TWO-TIME GOVERNOR OF LOUISIANA, JIMMIE DAVIS...AND HIS STEEL GUITAR PLAYER, CHARLES MITCHELL. LIKE THE HAPPY BIRTHDAY SONG...THIS SONG WAS ALSO EASY TO SING AND EASY TO REMEMBER TO QUICKLY BECAME POPULAR IN SCHOOLS THROUGHOUT AMERICA. BY THE MIDDLE OF WORLD WAR II, THE SONG HAD SPREAD AROUND THE WORLD WITH THE AMERICAN SOLDIER AND SAILOR...AND BY THE TIME THE WAR ENDED, IT HAD BECOME ONE OF THE BEST KNOWN SONGS IN THE WORLD. TODAY, MORE THAN 40 YEARS LATER, IT REMAINS ONE OF THE BEST KNOWN SONGS IN THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE. THE SONG IS "YOU ARE MY SUNSHINE"...AND WE'RE GOING TO HEAR A BIT OF SEVERAL VERSIONS...BEGINNING WITH THE JIMMIE DAVIS ORIGINAL FROM MARCH 1940:

OUTRO/INTRO: JIMMIE DAVIS FIRST RECORDED "YOU ARE MY SUNSHINE" IN 1940, AND HE
LATER USED THE SONG IN BOTH CAMPAIGNS WHEN HE SUCCESSFULLY RAN FOR THE GOVERNORSHIP
OF LOUISIANA IN 1944 AND AGAIN IN 1959. MEANWHILE, IN JUNE 1941, GENE

AUTRY RECORDED THE SONG. AUTRY'S PROMINENCE IN AMERICAN POPULAR CULTURE AS A MOVIE COWBOY GAVE HIM AN ACCESS TO PUBLIC TASTES THAT NO OTHER COUNTRY SINGER OF THE TIME POSESSED. AND GENE'S VERSION OF "YOU ARE MY SUNSHINE" BECAME THE BIGGEST COUNTRY HIT OF 1811:

OUTRO/INTRO:GENE AUTRY'S 1941 HIT OF "YOU ARE MY SUNSHINE" LED TO ANOTHER VERSION OF THE SONG THAT SAME YEAR BY THE LAWRENCE WELK ORCHESTRA. AND BILLBOARD MAGAZINE CALLED THE SONG "THE TAP ROOM AND TAVERN CLASSIC OF THE YEAR." BUT THE BEST WAS YET TO COME. THE VOICE OF BING CROSBY HAS BEEN HEARD BY MORE PEOPLE THAN ANY OTHER VOICE IN HISTORY...AND ON JULY 8TH, 1941, BING RECORDED "YOU ARE MY SUNSHINE":

OUTRO/INTRO: WE'RE TRACING THE EVOLUTION OF COUNTRY MUSIC'S MOST FAMOUS SONG, "YOU ARE MY SUNSHINE" AND THAT'S PART OF BING CROSBY'S HIT VERSION FROM 1941. THROUGHOUT THE 1940'S AND FIFTIES THE SONG WAS RECORDED BY COUNTLESS COUNTRY AND POP SINGERS. IN THE 1960'S, THE TUNE CONTINUED TO PROSPER WITH VERSIONS BY ACTS INCLUDING NAT KING COLE, ANDY WILLIAMS AND COUNT BASIE. BUT IT WAS THE MUSICAL GENIUS OF RAY CHARLES THAT TOOK "YOU ARE MY SUNSHINE" TO THE TOP OF THE POP CHARTS IN 1982:

OUTRO/INTRO: RAY CHARLES....BING CROSBY....GENE AUTRY....AND JIMMIE DAVIS ARE

JUST FOUR OF THE MORE THAN 350 ACTS WHO HAVE RECORDED "YOU ARE MY SUNSHINE." THE

SONG WAS ALSO USED IN MOVIES AS WELL AS IN RADIO AND TELEVISION COMMERCIALS. BY

THE TIME THE 1970'S ROLLED AROUND, THE TUNE HAD RECEIVED EVERY IMAGINABLE

FORM OF ACKNOWLEDGEMENT EXCEPT ONE. AND IN 1978, THE STATLER BROTHERS TOOK CARE

OF THAT WHEN THEY WROTE AND RECORDED A SONG ABOUT "YOU ARE MY SUNSHINE"

OUTRO: FROM 1978, THERE'S A BIT OF THE STATLER BROTHERS' SALUTE TO "YOU ARE MY

SUNSHINE"...AND IF YOU HEAR ANYONE ASK "DO YOU KNOW YOU ARE MY SUNSHINE", YOU CAN

TELL 'EM THAT IT'S THE MOST POPULAR AND MOST VALUABLE SONG IN THE HISTORY OF

COUNTRY MUSIC! STILL TO COME ON THE AMERICAN COUNTRY COUNTDOWN "BOOK OF

RECORDS", THE FIRST SINGLE TO SIMULTANEOUSLY OCCUPY THE #1 SPOT ON THREE CHARTS....AND THE

BIGGEST COUNTRY SINGLE IN CHART HISTORY!

INTRO: I'M BOB KINGSLEY AND THIS IS THE AMERICAN COUNTRY COUNTDOWN "BOOK OF

RECORDS." YOU KNOW, IN RECENT YEARS, CROSSOVER SONGS --HITS ON MORE THAN ONE CHART-- HAVE BEEN INCREASINGLY COMMON. BUT BACK IN 1956, THEY WERE ANYTHING BUT COMMON. OUTRO: FROM 1956, THAT'S ELVIS PRESLEY WITH "DON'T BE CRUEL"...THE FIRST RECORD EVER TO OCCUPY THE #1 SPOT SIMULTANEOUSLY ON ALL THREE CHARTS - COUNTRY, POP AND SOUL.

INTRO: WELL, WE'RE NOW ON THE LAST PAGE IN OUR "BOOK OF RECORDS"...AND WE'VE HEARD ALL THE SONGS BUT ONE. TO FIND THE BIGGEST COUNTRY SINGLE IN CHART HISTORY, WE HAD TO GO BACK TO 1951. THAT'S WHEN THE BIGGEST SINGLE TO EVER HIT BILLBOARD'S COUNTRY CHART SPENT WEEKS AT #1! AND THAT'S A RECORD THAT NOBODY HAS BEEN ABLE TO TOUCH...BEFORE OR SINCE. HERE IT IS...HANK SNOW'S "I'M MOVIN' ON":

OUTRO: FROM 1951, WRITTEN AND SUNG BY HANK SNOW..."I'M MOVIN' ON"...WITH 21 WEEKS AT #1 IS THE BIGGEST HIT SINGLE IN THE HISTORY OF BILLBOARD'S COUNTRY CHART!

AND THAT CLOSES OUR A.C.C. "BOOK OF RECORDS" FOR THE TIME BEING (CLOSING THEME).


