"John's Stewart is our most American songwriter, his vision shaped by his hearing of the beating of the heart of the country." So said the critic for *Rolling Stone*. John Stewart was a natural to be the host of The California Special. A Southern Californian from the start, he was born in San Diego and brought up in Riverside and Pasadena. While he was still a teen-ager he formed his first group called John Stewart and the Furies. In its short professional life they cut one single, for Vita Records, called "Rocking Anna." Shortly after that, in 1960, he joined The Kingston Trio where he was to stay for seven years until they broke up in 1967.

He spent the next few years writing songs for himself and other artists, including "Daydream Believer" for the Monkees and his own album, "California Bloodlines," inspired by the life and death of Robert Kennedy. Late in 1972 he signed with RCA and now seems well on his way to a long-awaited super-stardom. His speaking voice will come as no surprise to his many fans because his songs often include healthy portions of the spoken word. We welcome John Stewart to the ranks of commentators on musical America.
