## 1. AT40. OFFICIAL TO #1



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1. Paula Abdul's hit, "WILL YOU MARRY ME" features a rather famous guest star who plays the same instrument he played on his FIRST hit almost 30 years ago. Paula tells us about it:

**PAULA ABDUL ACTUALITY:** (:16) "I felt strong about the song and then musically, when I asked Stevie Wonder to play a harmonica solo on it, the song, just added so much magic. Stevie Wonder's my all time favorite recording artist. I just adore him and I adore his music."

2. Jody Watley came up with an interesting way to write for her new album, "Affairs of the Heart." She made herself a list ... You might find this pretty insightful stuff:

JODY WATLEY ACTUALITY: (:48) "With this particular album, 'Affairs of the Heart' I was more focused, in terms of the things that I wanted to write about. Each album that I make, I keep a journal of all my thoughts from the beginning through the lyrics, to everything that has to do with that particular project and at the beginning of this one, I wrote a list of things: commitment, intimacy, communication, how we take each other for granted, single parenthood, pride... so everything pretty much that I had listed as a topic, made its way on the album, whether, in the whole concept or as a line of the song, or a title, or something like that."

3. She was an artist torn between career and family -- KATHY TROCOLLI explains what was going on during the recording of her first Pop Album:

KATHY TROCOLLI ACTUALITY: (1:18) "My mother, who was like the woman of my heart, she was dying of cancer at the same time that I was making this record. And even when I was little, my mom ... in fact it's so funny, I just found a picture that I was showing my friends, I said, look at this about my mother. And it was when I was in fifth grade and it was me in the choir. The boys had navy blue pants and white shirts, and the girls had navy blue skirts and white blouses. Obviously the teacher said dress the kids this way. And I had a bright red jumper on! Bright red! And I laughed, when I looked at the picture 'cause I thought, my mother, like always said to me, you know, you've got a great voice, and you're going to be somebody... you know, that kind of thing. So, it was incredibly exciting for me, for her, to get to hear the record before she passed away. And also, I would literally go from the hospital to the studio, so this record's endeared to me because I didn't really sing, I really poured a lot of my heart out. Because when you're seeing somebody face life and death, you just don't go in hap-hazardly and sing a song. It comes from the bottom of your toes. Even the day before she died, I walked in the room and she was doing so bad and the nurse came in, she said Kath, show 'em the poster, show 'em the cover of the record. I'm like 'mom, calm down, you know! ' So, I know she's hearing me!"
