1. BOTH of Mr. Big's Top 40 hits have been ballads. We wondered about that and asked Bass player Billy Sheehan, to describe just WHAT you'd see and hear at a concert from MR. BIG:

BILLY SHEEHAN OF MR. BIG. ACTUALITY: (1:00) "Doing a live show is one big professional wrestling match. Well, you'd hear the members of the band, doing what they do on record, only live. And so, when you're live, you've got people in front of you and you've got no second take, and no overdub. There is an element of panic, that it's got to be right! And that panic kind of mutates into an energy and excitement that I live off of. It's my highest high. It's the best thing in the world for me, is to be on stage and have the audience there. Everybody's lookin', and it's gotta be right, and you're sweatin' it. All the people in the first five rows, prepare to get wet, because we sweat a lot, we work a lot on stage, and many people, when they come see us live, they say, you know, that's just like takin' the album and if you could somehow add ten times the energy, that's pretty much what it is like. What you see live is very much what you heard on the record, only now, with a lot of sweat, energy, and occasionally, some.. a... well, a little blood, will, a, you know... we know we're really rollin' when you start to lose blood."

2. Michael Jackson is riding the charts with his hit "In the Closet" and he's off on his World Tour... A few years ago, we had the chance to talk to him, on his 21st birthday. That day, he and his brothers told us how they got their start in music. This is like looking through the Jackson family scrapbook -- listen to this:

JACKSONS ACTUALITY: (1:25) "What really made me know that we were kind of good was when, I mean, you'd be up there dancin', all these quarters and dollars would be thrown at you and you're doin' splits and pickin' up money and puttin' it in your pocket. I mean our pockets were so loaded with money that we couldn't keep 'em up. We'd be loaded with money. We used to sell our pictures. You know, we'd go in the audience selling pictures... ha ha... then we'd think... who would want those pictures?" "We used to travel in the band, go to New York, do the Apollo, seven shows a night. Go to the Regal Theater, go to the Uptown, Kansas City, St. Louis, in a VW van, with all our equipment. The five of us, the drummer and the keyboard player. This was in 1966. And we would do like six shows a night, with Jackie Wilson, James Brown, The Siracle, The O'Jays, Gladys Knight and the Pips. You see, would come on Amateur Hour. See, these people, were, you know, they had like a local record goin' and said we would come on Amateur Hour. We would win the trophy, every time! And then we did the Regal, and this guy named Bobby Taylor and Gladys Knight told Motown about us. So, we decided to do a little audition. We auditioned for Berry Gordy in Detroit, and here we are singing and all the Motown stars were there. Diana Ross, Temptations, Smokey Robinson, and we're singing and all these people are watching us. And we did our whole show and they loved it, they really raved over it. And Diana Ross came over to us and she said specially, 'I love what I saw.' And she said she wanted to take a special interest in our career. And Motown moved us out to California. Half the group stayed with Berry Gordy, half the group stayed with Diana Ross. And we recorded and recorded, and ate out the refrigerator, and slept on the rugs! Ate up all the food!"

This song's been #1 Twice. For MARIAH CAREY today, and twenty-two years ago for the JACKSON FIVE. We got a hold of a couple of the writers of "I'LL BE THERE." The producer of the original hit, Hal Davis, and lyricist Willie Hutch. And Hal told us that a songwriter named Bob West came up with the melody of "I'LL BE THERE" and Hal was so knocked out with the tune, that as soon as he could, he ran into the studio with some musicians to cut some music tracks. But they weren't finished until the wee hours of the morning:

HAL DAVID ACTUALITY: (:16) "I couldn't wait, I knew it was a hit. At 3, 3:30, I was going to Willie's house, 'cause Willie's a fantastic writer and he's quick. So, I got over to willie's and woke he and his wife and his kids up, and which he thought I was ridiculous at that time of morning."

And lyric-man Willie Hutch picks up the story from there:

WILLIE HUTCH ACTUALITY: (:32) "So I go to the doorway with my pajamas on, I'm saying 'who is this?' Willie, Willie open up! So they say I got this track, and he played the track and he gave me the title and I said wow, what am I gonna do with this at four o'clock in the morning? Right? But the track was, I mean it was a great track, it was inspirational and I just sat there for a minute, I kind of closed my eyes, next thing I knew, I was writing lyrics. And so the first thing that came out of my mouth was 'you and I must make a pact, we must bring salvation back.' And I said, oh man, that's it, that's it!"
